



# Year 3

This Spring 2 half term we have been very busy in Year 3! We been exploring how plants grow in Science, where the different countries of the UK are and discussing our goals and individual skills in PSHE.

We have once again had the opportunity to work on and develop our speaking and listening skills whilst presenting our brilliant projects to our classes!



In D&T we have been designing and creating our own Moving Monsters using a pneumatic system! It was so much fun getting to experiment with different craft materials to make our monsters as creative (and scary) as possible!

In English we have been studying the short film 'Girl and Robot' where we have been writing our own playscripts, diary entries and alternative endings! We have been practicing using speech marks for dialogue and similes to add description!





Year 4

South America Day! We took part in football, Zumba, a Scavenger Hunt and carnival mask making!



We have been exploring poetry in English, looking at Rachel Rooney's book, 'My Life as a Goldfish'. We planned and performed different poems to our class.





In Geography we have been learning about South America. We have enjoyed using iPads to complete research into the Physical and Human Geography. We have found out about the different products that are exported and traded and can identify the different countries. In RW we have discussed why the Bible is sacred to Christians and what it contains. We have learned about the Ascension and Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came.









Our DT this term has been all about biscuits...yum yum! We made simple biscuits and then adapted the recipe to meet the design brief. The teachers got to taste-test our biscuits and were very pleased to have some extra treats in the staffroom!

## Year 5

It's been a very exciting half term in Year 5. It began with the arrival of 5 duck eggs in an incubator. This year, the ducklings hatched very quickly-we had our first arrival within 8 hours. The ducklings had lots of attention, and handling, in all 3 classes and became very used to the noise and excitement in the classroomwe also became used to their high-pitched quacking! We recorded the children's observations in a duckling diary, which was printed out and stuck in their science books. Having the ducklings really brought the children's science lessons, on life cycles, to life. We were all very sad to see them go!

In English, it's been all about description; we've written descriptive poems about the moon and a fairytale based on The Firebird.



We've also been learning about different faith stories and their explanations about, 'How the world was created,' in RW.



More recently, Year 5 have been designing and making moving toys. We started off by researching cam mechanisms and created a cardboard model to show a variety of different cams. Working in groups, the children were given the challenge of creating a structure to support 50g weights. They discovered that triangles and large foundations were good for construction. They used what they learnt to create their own moving toys.

> In Geography, we have been learning about Europe, including mapping skills, tourism and migration.



#### We've had another fun-filled term in Year 6...!



In Geography we have been learning about North America and El Salvador. The children have honed their research skills, working independently to produce fact-filled posters, comparisons between countries of North America and the rest of the world and time/climate zones!

Our Science topic this term was electricity! The children have worked hard to produce high-quality work displaying results on graphs from investigations on the effect of adding batteries/components to circuits.

In RW, we have learned about how different religions express their faiths, through art, music and colour.



After our whole school assembly each class created a shared board to show who has inspired them.





















## International Women's Day - Juniors



As a NASA employee, her mathematical skills were very important to the success of the first and other U.S. manned spaceflights.
