Reading Volunteers in KS2 (Year 3-6)

Reading 1:1 with children can really help make a difference to a child's confidence, their enjoyment of reading and their access to the rest of the curriculum.

We regularly get such positive feedback from the children and adults involved, and so are looking for reading volunteers to help children who need additional support.

These tend to be one-hour slots at the beginning or end of the school day, that are divided into four 15-minute 1:1 sessions. Training and guidance will be given before starting.

Slots are 8.45 -9.45 am and 2.15 - 3.15 pm. If you can help but need to stop reading at 9.30 am or 3.00 pm that is also fine - we are grateful for the support and will work with you to find slots that are manageable.

Creative Projects Y3-Y6

Earlier this week, we sent families of KS2 children the Creative Project grids for the year ahead. Each child should complete one project per term and the dates are set to give you the choice between doing the projects in term time or in the half-term breaks.

We encourage children to play to their strengths and interests, and are also open to their ideas for presenting their learning in a way that may not be shown on the year group grids. The learning should, however, be linked to either of the foundation topics listed for that term. This means that they can choose between a topic they are already learning in school or they can look ahead and start researching the topic coming up in the second half of the term.

Every child will be given the opportunity to share their project with their class but please bear with us, as this can take a couple of weeks as teachers work through a handful of projects per day with their classes. If you have any questions, please see your class teacher.

Book Bags

We know that many children bring a backpack, especially if they are in wraparound care, but as part of the uniform, the children in Infant School need a book bag. These can be purchased from School Days Uniform shop in Whitton or Stevensons in Twickenham.

Water Bottles

Please do not put your child's water bottle in their book bag. Several books have been ruined recently by leaking non-Trafalgar water bottles. Unfortunately we will have to make a charge from now on for damaged books.

Hoodies

Scooters and Bikes

Please do not allow your child, or toddlers to use their scooters or bikes in the school playgrounds. There have been several occasions recently when children and adults have been accidentally run in to. Thank you.

Parking

Parents using non-electric cars should not leave their engines on whilst dropping off/picking up. Car registration MM66 OFU has been noticed leaving the engine on while other children/the other parent remains in the car. Thank you.
