"EVERY DAY IS SAFER INTERNET DAY"

Here at Trafalgar, we don't wait for *Safer Internet Day* in February to talk to children about how to stay safe online: we believe that "every day is safer internet day" and that's because we know that most of our children are online most days.

One of the most important messages that we constantly reinforce is about being mindful of who you might be online with, as there is always the risk that who the person you are in contact with may not be who they say they are as well as not sharing personal details.

This is not about scaremongering: we want children to enjoy all the benefits that being online offers but we also know that children sometimes hear or see things that they shouldn't. Our advice in these situations is to turn the screen off and tell a trusted adult. For our younger children we talk about getting the 'Uh Oh feeling' as a way of knowing something might not be right.

Things for families to consider at home, would be:

- Talk to your children about their online habits by taking in interest in what they are doing, what games and sites they like and why.
- Read through our pupil SSO (staying safe online document in reading records) with you children to help them understand that the same advice applies at home as it does at school.
- Regularly check browsing histories and the content of messages sent and received.
- Ensure settings are managed appropriately eg turning off the automatic 'play next video' on YouTube.
- Let your children know that you understand that things might go wrong sometimes but that you can help put things right. It is important for them to understand they will not be in trouble if they ask you for help when something goes wrong.
- Ensure your home filtering is set appropriately.

Reading Volunteers in KS2 (Year 3-6)

Reading 1:1 with children can really help make a difference to a child's confidence, their enjoyment of reading and their access to the rest of the curriculum.

We regularly get such positive feedback from the children and adults involved, and so are looking for reading volunteers to help children who need additional support.

These tend to be one-hour slots at the beginning or end of the school day, that are divided into four 15-minute 1:1 sessions. Training and guidance will be given before starting.

- 2. your child's name
- 3. your child's year class (volunteers tend to read with children from other year groups)
- 4. which days & slots you are available for (eg Tues AM, Thu PM). We will only allocate volunteer readers one slot, so do say if you are happy to do more.

Slots are 8.45 - 9.45 am and 2.15 - 3.15 pm. If you can help but need to stop reading at 9.30 am or 3.00 pm that is also fine - we are grateful for the support and will work with you to find slots that are manageable.

The learning should, however, be linked to either of the foundation topics listed for that term. This means that they can choose between a topic they are already learning in school or they can look ahead and start researching the topic coming up in the second half of the term.

Every child will be given the opportunity to share their project with their class but please bear with us, as this can take a couple of weeks as teachers work through a handful of projects per day with their classes. If you have any questions, please see your class teacher.
