Well done to the Reception classes who performed the Nativity story so brilliantly.




We have been working hard on our Christmas crafts. We made seasons calendars, Christmas cards and even our very own clay candle holders! We hope you love them as much as we do.

In science we have been learning about different nocturnal animals. Did you know that we are diurnal animals? We especially loved learning all about owls and why they are so good at hunting during the night.



The Year 3 staff are so proud of each and every child for how hard they have worked this half-term. We have been very busy!


English

Design and Technology

We have been developing our cooking skills of cutting, chopping, grating and mixing. Look at the delicious stuffed vegetables the children produced!







Geography

Children have researched and learnt about climate zones. They created some informative and colourful posters and some sensational savannah scenes!



In Year 4 we've had a half term full of great learning and fun experiences! We looked at the text 'Cloudbusting' by Malorie Blackman and wrote our own poetry in English, we explored column method and built on our timetables in Maths and we presented our amazing creative projects!

We also had our Brass performance to family and friends where we showed off our musical skills with trumpets, trombones, cornets & baritone horns!









In D&T this half term we have been designing and creating wire loop games! We used what we learnt in Science last half term about electrical circuits and worked in small groups to create our own!

In Science this half term we have been studying states of matter. We took part in a fun experiment which involved using scales to weigh a fizzy drink before shaking it, opening it (ahh!) and then weighing it again afterwards! This helped us discover whether gas has mass.

SOUPER SOUP!

this half term, Year 5 has been immersed in soup! We started off by researching a range of different soups from around the world; their origins, ingredients and whether they should be served hot or cold. We worked in groups to record our findings before reporting back to the class.

Our next lesson saw us taste-testing a mixture of soups, describing them in terms of taste, texture and aroma. We then went on to rank them. Across the year group, the Broccoli and Stilton soup was universally disliked, and the Thai Green Chicken Soup was a firm favourite. This would inform our decisions on which soups to make later in the term. Other lessons included learning about seasonality and the impact of importing food, from across the world, on the environment. After working in our design teams to choose our recipes, it was time to create our masterpieces. With the help of parents and other adults in school, each group brought their recipes to life. From Thai Green Chicken Noodle Soup to Hearty Pasta Soup, the individual design teams created some delicious outcomes. Finally, we evaluated our products, and the process, and created adverts to celebrate our soups and our achievements.



Alongside our soup making, we have been learning about the adventures of Earnest Shackleton in our English lessons. We have written job applications, hoping to become a member of crew on Endurance, and diary entries about our experiences. We have also written letters, one of which was to persuade him to listen to our reasons for either leaving camp to try to get home or staying put in the hope of being rescued. An exceedingly difficult dilemma!

OTHER CURRICULUM AREAS

It has been an exciting and busy term, across the curriculum in Year 5. In our religion lessons, we have been learning about the work of different charities including Christian Aid, Islamic Relief, Children in Need and Fairtrade. Whilst in geography, we have learnt about volcanoes and earthquakes. During our science lessons, we have been investigating which materials make the best thermal insulators and in **PSHE** (Personal, Social, Health and Education), we have been learning about identity and discrimination. During our PE (Physical Education) lessons we have enjoyed learning new football, hockey and rugby skills, and practising these. In our maths lessons, fractions have been our focus throughout this half term.

English – The Invention Hugo Cabret

We have really enjoyed reading about the history of cinema and the creation of special effects through the novel 'The Invention of Hugo Cabret'. In response to this book, the children have written some fabulous narratives, putting themselves in the shoes of our protagonist, Hugo, and a biography about Georges Melies.




We have been learning about how light travels and making our own periscopes to prove it. Useful for getting a better view at the Christmas performances!


> Having researched different types of drawstring bags, the children designed and made their own before evaluating the end product. We think you'll agree, there are some pretty cool designs!

It has been a busy half-term of sporting fixtures and events for the Junior School this Autumn. We start with our Boys & Girls football teams who both recorded league victories against St Richard Reynolds and sit top of their respective league tables. They also both attended the Richmond Borough Football Championships. The Boys (Top Right) only conceded two goals on the way to the Plate Quarter-Final. The Girls team (Middle Left) went a step further, remaining undefeated all the way to the Semi-Finals of the main cup competition without conceding a single goal! However, a heart-breaking penalty shoot-out loss to St John's ended our hopes of becoming Richmond Borough Champions.

There was also a Year 3 Boys Football Festival (Middle Right), as you can see the boys were very excited to be wearing the school Adidas kit paid for by our generous PTA! They not only looked like professionals but played like them too as they made it all the way to the Quarter-Final before losing 2-1 to St John's.


