Y5 girl takes on Lidl and Wins

When Poppy in 5R brought a packet of 'Mango & Passion Fruit Snacking Fruit' into school, she thought everything would be fine. However, soon after eating it, she suffered an allergic reaction which caused a rash to develop and for her to vomit twice.

The snack from Lidl bore no warnings about containing nuts (and neither had anyone suspected that it would) but, on closer inspection, Poppy and her mum discovered in the list of ingredients that it was in fact 25% cashew nut! Not wanting anyone else to have a similar reaction or worse, Poppy wrote to our local MP, Munira Wilson, for support and in turn she wrote to Lidl. Lidl agreed that the packaging was inadequate and should indeed have contained a warning on the front; they have since agreed to change their packaging to clearly show the potential allergen. Poppy also received a reply from Munira Wilson congratulating her for speaking up and making an important, positive change.

"Dear Poppy,

Please find below the response I have received from Lidl. As you can see they have in response to your customer feedback changed the packaging, and you should be congratulated, as it is not easy to get companies to go beyond what is required by law.
