Welcome back to the final half term of this academic year! We hope you all had an enjoyable break and are looking forward to the exciting events over the next few weeks.

#### **Reminders - Fixed Penalty Notices**

We would like to reiterate the importance of attendance and punctuality. Trafalgar children have shown an incredible amount of commitment to their learning and we are determined to underpin this with a commitment to ensuring absence is kept to a minimum. Children have a right to come to school and it does not take many days of absence for a child's attendance rate to fall to levels which are cause for concern. We also know there is a direct correlation between attendance and progress. We have updated our Attendance and Lateness Policy which is available on the Policy pages of both school websites to fully explain how the use of Fixed Penalty Notices (FPNs) is included in Trafalgar's process of attendance management. #### **Online Gaming**

Like many other schools, we are aware that we have children who chat or game together online outside of school and that some of the platforms carry PEGI ratings above what is suitable for primary-aged children (EG; Fortnite is 13+ and WhatsApp is 16+).

Sometimes inappropriate things are said or written and this, understandably, causes some upset for children, as well as then taking away from the school day when issues have to be sorted out in school.

We are therefore reminding all families of the importance of regularly reviewing their children's time online - what they are doing, who they are connecting with and so on. For example, if they are gaming with a headset on, do you know who they are talking to and what is being said to them?

#### **Funding for biodiversity**

The school was lucky enough to secure a grant of just under £2000 from the Crane Valley Community Grants scheme to purchase much-needed equipment that will enhance the local area and support Science learning. A new ecosystem investigation station will be installed in the Junior School to allow children to observe habitats up close, various pond-dipping and bug hunting equipment will allow children across the school to observe and record animals in their natural habitats, and repairs and improvements to our pond and wildlife areas at Meadway will ensure the school site offers diverse habitats that form part of the green corridor that runs along the Crane Valley.
